

# March of the 104<sup>th</sup> (New Brunswick) Regiment of Foot

## A Very Canadian Story

During the War of 1812, the winter of 1813 was one of extreme cold and heavy snows. Between February and April, the 104<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot marched more than 1100 kilometres from Fredericton, New Brunswick to Kingston, Ontario to reinforce British troops and thwart an expected invasion by the Americans. This effort by a regiment of poorly clothed, frostbitten and hungry soldiers stands as an incredible feat in military history.
